Resilience Project

We had a great turn out to listen to a very exciting speaker who came to the school as part of the Resilience Project on Thursday evening. Martin Heppell has worked with many AFL teams and soccer clubs to build resilience in people. This was an opportunity to learn how parents can best help their children develop resilience, support mental health and promote well-being in their children.

National Walk to School Day

Last Friday was National Walk to School Day! It was good to hear that there were many families who chose to walk to school on this morning where they were greeted by children with stickers to mark the occasion As we now have our active paths installed around the area it was great to make full use of them. Thank you to Miss Cecil and Miss Doutch for organising the morning.

Foundation Barbecue

The transition barbecue was a great success. There were many prospective Foundation parents and children who came along to enjoy some time at school and find out a little bit more about the programs running. The children did many interesting activities prepared by Ms Furyk, Ms Avraham and Ms Drennan while Mrs Ward and I toured parents around so they could get to know the school a little better while enjoying a sausage from the BBQ. A special thank you to Belinda Ricardo who came to school to greet new families and to Samantha May, Jen Forster, Nic Sutherland and Linda Donaldson from the Parents' Committee who catered for our new families.

School Parking Warning

A reminder to all Parents who are dropping off and picking up at the 2 minute zones in Coolac St and Silver St. There will be Council parking officers around who will give you an infringement notice if you stay longer than the time indicated on the sign. The 2 minute zones are designed to be a kiss and go spot, not a permanent parking area. If you are parking for longer than 2 minutes, please find an alternative park to avoid a costly fine.

Please also make sure you are not parked over someone's driveway or too close to corners as it obstructs views and can be dangerous.

<u>Australian Early Development</u> <u>Census</u>

The Australian Early Development Census will be undertaken by our Foundation teachers with our Foundation students. It is an anonymous census which will focus on the group of students rather than individuals. It measures the developmental progress of children as they start their first full time year of school. The results are used to provide the right type of services, resources and support for our children and communities in the future.

Thanks Parents' Committee

A big thank you to our Parents' Committee who have agreed to use some of their funds to purchase a new defibrillation machine for our school. This will increase the chances of someone surviving cardiac arrest by up to 80-85 percent. The machine will have the capability to talk people through the process of reviving a person whose heart has stopped as well as shock the heart to start again. It is well worth the money if we can save a life. It will be stored in the First Aid room. We are also using some of the money to buy new soccer and basketball nets.

Life Education

Life Education lessons have commenced this week for our children. You will notice the Life Ed van sitting beside the hall. The children will learn about a variety of health issues and learn how to stay fit and healthy. A highlight will be Harold the Giraffe's appearance in the van during the fortnight.

Cross Country

Congratulations to all of our Years 3-6 students who participated in the District Cross Country last Tuesday. Your efforts were extremely pleasing to see and it was great to see so many tough it out and finish. Eight of our students finished in the top ten and will go on to represent Cheltenham East PS at the Zone Cross Country. 
Extra- Curricular Activities










This book shows us that when you are brave, you might make a new friend and they can introduce you to more friends!

Congratulations to 3AS who improved from 46% in week 4 to 83% on Walk to School Day!


Thank you to everyone who got involved in Walk to School day on Friday. It was great to see so many students being active and less cars on the road. We had 330 students actively travel on the day!


