School Vision

Cheltenham East students are empowered learners who are flexible thinkers with the skills and knowledge to respond critically to their world.

The following are our three main goals in our Strategic plan:

- 1 To achieve a trend of improved learning growth in all areas of the curriculum.
- 2 To ensure students access a safe, happy, stimulating learning environment that encourages them to be resilient, confident and persistent.
- 3 To develop a cohesive and consistent approach to building students' social and emotional health to reinforce the school values.

The following are key improvement strategies which we believe will allow us to achieve excellence in teacher practice:

- Build the capacity of teachers to implement an approach to classroom management that supports an engaging and productive learning environment
- Develop teacher capacity to incorporate student agency in the teaching and learning framework.
- Strengthen professional learning teams by building their capacity to analyse and reflect on data
- Professional learning observation and feedback (define what it is - shared understanding and how it will work within levels and across the school)

The following are key improvement strategies in curriculum planning:

- Allocate time for ongoing peer observations and feedback opportunities
- Ensure an agreed curriculum is consistently implemented across the school
- Apply the agreed instructional model to all key learning areas of the school
- Gather evidence to support teacher judgements and for students to set learning goals
- Elicit constructive feedback from students to ascertain their level of understanding
- Develop and document a 'CEPS' Pedagogical Plan that will integrate and align the school's programs and activities

Lost Property


We have lots of unnamed lost property at the moment and lots of named items missing. Parents please check your child's clothing to make sure that they haven't brought home someone else's items.





Frameworks For Improving Students Outcomes (FISO)\

IMPROVEMENT CYCLE





SENTRAL / REPORTING UPDATE

Moving to a new reporting platform has meant that CEPS has been able to craft the reports to meet our needs (following DET guidelines). As a result, there will be a much stronger focus on attitude and effort for the semester 1 reports, giving parents a greater insight to their children's behaviour and engagement across all subjects.

This focus will also shift us away from the previous A – E marking system which can at times be confusing. Instead there will be focus on learning growth with teachers commenting on where your child sits in regards to their growth across the different subjects. While the scale in figure 1. remains in front of the report, at each subject area the old letter mark will be replaced with scale in figure 2.

*It is important to remember that a report is snapshot of your child's progress at a certain point in time.

Progress and growth is not always linear and it should be expected that there will be variations in achievement between reports and even years.

There will be further updates on how the reports will look throughout the term.




Book School Interviews Online


Dear Parents


