End of Year Celebrations


As we near the end of the year, we will celebrate with a series of special events.

Access will be restricted, so please minimise traffic flow or allow extra time for your commute to avoid disappointment.


The traffic management will be implemented by Australian Traffic Control with Traffic Controllers onsite to assist with local access and pedestrian movements around the worksite.
