Dear Parents and Carers

My apologies for the delay in receiving this communication. We now have the official directive from the Department of Education and Training Victoria. Today the Acting Premier has announced new circuit breaker restrictions for Victoria to swiftly address the recent COVID-19 outbreak.

The restrictions will be in place from 11.59pm tonight for a seven-day period.

Following advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, all Victorian schools will move to a period of remote and flexible learning from Monday 31 May to Thursday 3 June inclusive.

Tomorrow (Friday 28 May) will be a student-free day to allow schools time to prepare. Remote and flexible learning will begin on Monday 31 May.

LEARNING PROGRAMS

The Years Foundation-2 students will receive notification via Classroom Dojo of when work packs will be available to collect from school tomorrow (Friday). Further learning program advice for F-2 students will be relayed via Classroom Dojo, and commence Monday 31st.

The school will provide remote learning programs starting Monday 31st for Years 3-6 students. Y3-6 students should log on to Google Classroom to receive their instructions for the first day of the learning program for remote and flexible learning on Monday. Teachers will continue to communicate with families using Classroom Dojo.

As with other remote learning periods, our school will provide on-site supervision for students in the following categories:

- **Children where both parents and/or carers are authorised workers who cannot work from home, work for an essential provider and where no other supervision arrangements can be made:**
 - Where there are two parents/carers, both must be authorised workers, working outside the home in order for their children to be eligible for on-site provision
 - For single parents/ carers, the authorised worker must be working outside the home in order for their children to be eligible for on-site provision.

- **Children experiencing vulnerability, including:**

- children in out-of-home care
- children deemed vulnerable by a government agency, funded family or family violence service, and is assessed as requiring education and care outside the family home
- children identified by a school or early childhood service as vulnerable, including via referral from a government agency, or funded family or family violence service, homeless or youth justice service or mental health or other health service.
