WEEKLY ROUTINES

ENGLISH

Speaking & Listening

This term the children will participate in regular news telling sessions and will be encouraged to present to the class, through role plays, reading aloud and sharing experiences during circle time.

Writing

Writing tasks this term will include creating and sharing short recounts using familiar and high-frequency words. Students will be encouraged to write sentences that include capital letters and full stops. They will practise their handwriting skills to improve letter formation, writing on lines, and using correct sizing. Additionally, they will be encouraged to use the sounds they know to spell simple words.

Phonics and Reading

The students will continue to practise blending and segmenting words regularly, using decodable and authentic texts. They will be exposed to long vowel sounds and consolidate their knowledge of digraphs. They will engage in daily reading activities to apply their knowledge of letters, sounds, and high-frequency words, aiming to read with increasing fluency. The students will listen to a range of stories and non-fiction texts, and engage in comprehension activities to identify and make connections between characters, settings, and events in stories. They will be encouraged to share their own feelings and thoughts about the texts they read.

MATHS

In Maths this term, the students will develop a deeper understanding of number, with a focus on the concepts of addition, subtraction and place value. They will also continue to explore 2D shapes and 3D objects. The students will use positional language to describe the location of themselves and objects in relation to other people and items, with in a familiar space. Students will continue to improve their number fluency and counting collections. They will match numbers to amounts and practise number formation.

HUMANITIES

This term the students will be exploring the past, present and the future. They will do this by investigating toys and how they have changed over time.

Students will investigate toys they played with when they were younger and toys they use now. Students will pose questions to their parents, grandparents or

'special friends' about what toys they may have used when growing up and explain how they are different.



ICT

This term, Foundation students will continue to have allocated ICT lessons once per week in the classroom.

They will be encouraged to log on to an Ipad independently to different apps, using headphones and the device safely and appropriately.

Students will be using Mathletics and Phonics Hero. The students' login details can be found in their home reading journal if they would like to do some of the tasks at home.

CEPS VALUES

COURTESY RESPECT CO-OPERATION RESPONSIBILITY

Our Term 3 School value is 'Co-operation'. Friday afternoon assembly awards will be given to children who have shown personal growth specific to the skill. Parents will be informed if their child is receiving the award, via Class Dojo.
